- BURNS, FRANK L. The Vanishing Glory of Great Egg Harbor Bay Region, N. J. *Oölogist*, 1929, pp. 33-39.—The writer seems to be unaware of the recent return of several of the seaside birds as breeders since he quotes no observations later than 1899!
- CAREY, HENRY R. Egret at Pocono Lake, Pa. *Auk*, p. 536.—Two present Aug. 1-11 and probably later.
- CHANCE, LEDA W. The Material of a Wren's Nest. *Oölogist*, 1929, p. 239.—At Lawrenceville, Pa. Contained 555 pieces of material.
- CHAPIN, J. P. AND OTHERS. Pomarine Jaegers and Phalaropes off shore in November. *Auk*, 1929, p. 102.—Records of these species and of Kittiwakes and Parasitic Jaegers off the New Jersey coast.
- CHRISTMAS BIRD CENSUSES. *Bird-Lore*, 1929, pp. 33-39.—Thirteen for New Jersey, and fourteen for Pennsylvania. The Cape May record of 80 species made by D. V. O. C. members led the east but the Chimney Swift observation would seem to be more likely referable to the Tree Swallow.
- CLAUSEN, ROBERT T. Notes from Northern New Jersey. *Auk*, 1929, p. 555.—Tree Sparrow, until May 5, 1929 at Troy Meadows and a lone Mockingbird in Passaic, April 29-July 25.
- DISE, MARY D. American Egret (*Casmerodius egretta*) at Williams Lake, York County, Pa. *Auk*, 1929, p. 231.—One with Little Blues seen in July and August from 1925 to 1928.
- DOAK, WILLIAM C. The Sooty Tern (*Sterna fuscata*) at Stone Harbor, N. J. *Auk*, 1929, p. 226.—A decomposed bird found Jan. 13, 1929.
- EATON, WARREN F. Little Gull (*Larus minutus*) at Port Newark, N. J. *Auk*, 1929, p. 376.—One seen May 12, 1929.
- EDWARDS, JAMES L. Little Gull at Point Pleasant, N. J. *Auk*, 1929, p. 532.—One observed Aug. 11, 1929.
- EMLÉN, J. T., JR. Caspian Terns (*Sterna caspia imperator*) at Palmyra, N. J. *Auk*, 1929, p. 534.—Three observed April 21, 1929 in company with Herring Gulls.
- HAUSMAN, LEON AUGUSTUS. The Hawks of New Jersey and their Relation to Agriculture. Bull. 439, New Jersey Agr. Exper. Sta., January, 1927. Pp. 1-48.
- HAUSMAN, LEON AUGUSTUS. Woodpeckers, Nuthatches and Creepers of New Jersey. Bull. 470, New Jersey Agr. Exper. Sta., New Brunswick, N. J., pp. 1-48.

- HAUSMAN, LEON AUGUSTUS. Connecticut Warbler in New Jersey in Spring. *Auk*, 1929, p. 395.—June 6, 1929, near Trenton, with exceptional opportunity for observation.
- HUBER, WHARTON. Mockingbird Nesting just outside the Limits of Philadelphia. *Auk*, 1929, p. 554.—Birds seen by Miss C. J. Clair, May 26, 1929, one singing; nest found May 30 with three eggs in Mt. Moriah Cemetery, Delaware Co., was deserted June 2 and only one bird could be found.
- KUSER, CYNTHIA DRYDEN. Osprey Feeds on Ducks. *Bird-Lore*, 1929, p. 260.—Twice caught young ducks on a pond of a game farm.
- LIVINGSTON, PHILIP A. The Snowy Egret (*Egretta thula thula*) at Avalon, N. J. *Auk*, 1929, p. 230.—One seen with Egrets and Little Blues, Sept. 23, 1928.
- LUTTRINGER, L. A., JR. Some Wild Pets. *Oölogist*, 1929, pp. 118–126.—Photograph of White Pelican caught on an island in the Susquehanna River, Oct. 6, 1926, and notes on other birds caught in Pennsylvania.
- LUTTRINGER, L. A., JR. Many Egrets. *Oölogist*, 1929, p. 130.—Many records for Pennsylvania.
- MIDDLETON, RAYMOND J. Lincoln's Sparrow Wintering at Jeffersonville, Montgomery Co., Pa. *Auk*, 1929, p. 392.—One caught repeatedly Nov. 24, 1928–March 2, 1929.
- MILLER, RICHARD F. Nesting of the Long-eared Owl in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. *Oölogist*, 1929, p. 40.—Data for six nests.
- POOLE, EARL L. Northern Phalarope (*Lobipes lobatus*) in Pennsylvania. *Auk*, 1929, p. 108.—One at Moselem, Bucks Co., Aug. 26, 1928.
- POOLE, EARL L. Savannah Sparrow Nesting near Reading, Pa. *Auk*, 1929, p. 550.—Observed during June and adults with young found, July 14, 1929.
- POOLE, EARL L. Ducks and Other Water Birds on the Reading, Pa., Reservoir. *Auk*, 1929, pp. 534–536.—A very important list.
- POTTER, JULIAN K. Buff-breasted Sandpiper at Brigantine, New Jersey. *Auk*, 1929, p. 109.—Six seen, Sept. 9, 1928, along with 30 Willets, 6 White-rumped Sandpipers and 1 Baird's Sandpiper.
- POTTER, JULIAN K. The Season—Philadelphia Region. *Bird-Lore*, 1929, pp. 11, 123, 197, 269, 341, 409.—An exceedingly valuable summary of local observations for eastern Pennsylvania and southern New Jersey.
- QUATTLEBAUM, W. DAN. Florida Gallinule in Northern New Jersey. *Auk*, 1929, p. 380.—Gallinules, Coots and Pied-billed Grebes on a marsh near Whippany, N. J., April 13–May 1, 1929.
- SEIPLE, STANLEY J. American Egret at Conneaut Lake, Pennsylvania. *Auk*, 1929; p. 104.—One seen Aug. 24, 1928.
- STONE, WITMER. A White Heron Roost at Cape May, N. J. *Auk*, 1929, p. 537.—A flock of 25 Egrets and 524 Little Blues occupied the roost from late July until early September.

- SUTTON, GEORGE MIKSCH. Yellow-headed Blackbird in Pennsylvania. *Auk*, 1929, p. 119.—One claimed to have been seen at Turtle Creek, Allegheny Co., April 13, 1928. (Observation questioned, cf. *Auk*, 1929, p. 390.)
- SUTTON, GEORGE MIKSCH. White Pelican in Chester County, Pennsylvania. *Auk*, 1929, p. 104.—One captured on Kurtz's Dam, Chester Co., Sept. 24, 1928.
- SUTTON, GEORGE MIKSCH. Notes on the Status of the Ruffed Grouse in Pennsylvania. *American Game*, Aug.-Sept., 1928, p. 75.
- URNER, CHARLES A. The Southward Shore-bird Flight on the New Jersey Coast in 1928. *Auk*, 1929, pp. 311-325.—An important record of 31 species.

- BECK, HERBERT H. Yellow-crowned Night Heron in Lancaster County, Pa. *Auk*, 1930, p. 555.—An adult seen near Lititz, May 4, 1930.
- BENDER, R. O. Golden Plover (*Pluvialis dominicus*) near Dover, Delaware. *Auk*, 1930, p. 80.—Aug. 4, 1929. See *Auk*, 1931, p. 416 for correction in description of plumage.
- BRADY, ETHEL W. Evening Grosbeak in Delaware. *Auk*, 1930, p. 420.—Four at Middletown, April 12-May 5, 1930.
- BROWN, BEN R. A Pocket Nest. *Bird-Lore*, 1930, p. 201.—House Wren's nest in a coat pocket.
- BURNS, F. L. Nature Faking by a Mathematical Rule of Thumb. *Oölogist*, 1930, p. 38.—A severe arraignment of the works of the late Thos. G. Gentry, although curiously enough the name of the culprit is nowhere mentioned. The writer seems unaware of other similar criti-

- COX, ALICE M. From a Window in Winter. *Bird-Lore*, 1930, p. 418.—Brown Thrasher observed Dec. 12, 1929, at Montclair, N. J.
- DEBES, V. A. Snowy Egrets and Other Birds near Media, Pa. *Auk*, 1930, p. 558.—One Snowy Egret, Aug. 16; also Least, Semipalmated, Pectoral, Stilt, Western, White-rumped and Western Sandpipers and both species of Yellow-legs, during July and early August.
- DUNN, MABEL S. Pine Grosbeak in New Jersey. *Bird-Lore*, 1930, p. 200.—A flock of 12 at Belvidere, for several weeks prior to Feb. 14, 1930.
- FRICKE, REINHOLD L. Unusual Observations for Western Pennsylvania. *Auk*, 1930, p. 572.—Short-billed Marsh Wrens breeding in Pymatuning swamp also occurrence of shore-birds and Little Blue Herons in Crawford and Westmoreland Counties.
- GILLESPIE, JOHN A. A Spring Flight of Broad-winged Hawks. *Auk*, 1930, p. 83.—Kintnersville, Pa., April 21.
- GILLESPIE, JOHN A. Homing Instinct in Cowbirds. *Bird Banding*, 1930, p. 42.—A female liberated 20 miles from the trapping station returned in 4 hours and from less distant points in a shorter time.

- POTTER, JULIAN K. Willet Breeding in Southern New Jersey. *Auk*, 1930, p. 561.—Cumberland County marshes on Delaware Bay, June 29, 1930, downy young found.
