  - 11:30 – arrive back at lodging

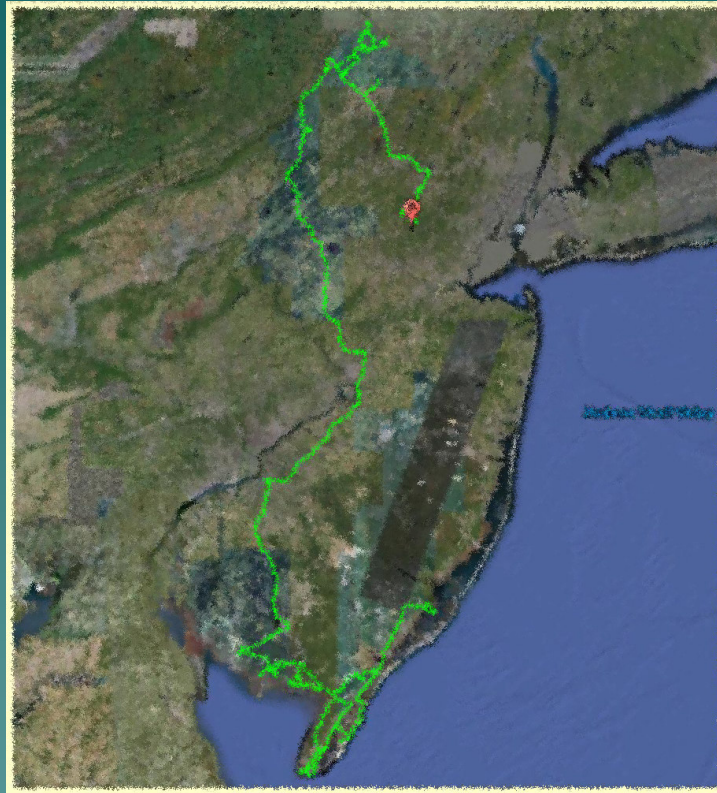
